



# Wrap Up - Trail Class Demo with Debbie Storey

On April 13, Courier Equine Park hosted a **Trail Class** demo with Debbie Storey of Top Line Training in Red Deer.

Debbie is a multi-national winner in Trail and coaches' amateurs to Regional and National wins. Her demo horse for the evening was a national champion trail gelding owned by Lorraine Prowse. Debbie rode through the obstacles, explaining how each obstacle should be done, and how it is scored.

Attendees were able to walk the course, while Debbie explained what to look for in a walk-thru and then Lorraine rode her gelding through the course while Debbie explained how she would judge each obstacle.

### It was a very informational evening, with lots of laughs.

Thanks to Debbie for educating (and entertaining) us, to Lorraine for bringing her lovely gelding, and to Hedi and Bob Klassen of Courier Equine Park for hosting the demo and sponsoring SAHA members to attend.











# Wrap Up - Trail Riding 101 – Session 1

On April 22, 6 enrollees in the 2023 addition of Trail Riding 101 met at the Neave/Zelt farm. Weather conditions were on the cool/windy side and it was fortunate that a wall tent with a wood burning stove was available for the duration of the session.

Under the direction of Karen and Ken Zelt, each participant was asked to give a brief accounting of why they were engaged in the session and what was their current status as to their desire to trail ride. Some of the members described past trail rides where they encountered difficult situations and were thrown off their mounts which caused some injuries. A central theme of these situations involved unacceptable behaviours by other riders which inturn created the problems. Number of riders in the group seemed to have a bearing on the resultant problem. The larger the group the greater the probability of a problem. It became quite apparent that before some of the attendees could regain their confidence they needed to join in rides with 3 to 4 participants and the duration of the rides should be less than 3 hours.

After the members finished discussing their past experiences, Ken made a presentation on the equipment that was needed for a trail ride. This included tack (saddle, halters, saddle and horn bags, safety supplies (cell phone, medications etc.), maps. Some time was also dedicated to some knots that should be learnt. With the current requirement at many staging/camping sites to use highlines, the specific knots for the highline system was presented.

The participants felt the session provided a needed review of trail riding and are looking forward to session #2 which will involve dealing with a variety of obstacles which might be encountered during a trail ride.
